Parish Health Ministry: Tips for Preventing Birth Defects



January is National Birth Defects Prevention Month. Not all birth defects can be prevented. But a woman can increase her own chance of having a healthy baby. Many birth defects happen very early in pregnancy, sometimes before a woman even knows she is pregnant. Remember that about half of all pregnancies are unplanned. Here are some steps women can take to get ready for a healthy pregnancy:

- Take a vitamin with 400 micrograms of folic acid daily
- Avoid alcohol, tobacco, street drugs
- Prevent infection by washing hands often
- See a healthcare professional regularly
- Talk with a healthcare professional about medical or any medication issues
- Question the use of substances at work or in the home that could do possible harm to developing baby
- Eat a healthful, balanced diet
- Avoid unpasteurized (raw) milk or any derivatives
- Avoid eating raw or undercooked meat

While pregnant, maintain these healthful habits, get early prenatal care, and go to every appointment. For more information, call Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 1-800-INFO or visit www.cdc.gov/birthdefects, www.marchofdimess.org, or www.nj.gov/health.
