



### Parish Health Ministry: Tips for Preventing Birth Defects



January is National Birth
Defects Prevention
Month. Not all birth
defects can be
prevented. But a woman
can increase her own
chance of having a

healthy baby. Many birth defects happen very early in pregnancy, sometimes before a woman even knows she is pregnant. Remember that about half of all pregnancies are unplanned. Here are some steps women can take to get ready for a healthy pregnancy:

- Take a vitamin with 400 micrograms of folic acid daily
- Avoid alcohol, tobacco, street drugs
- Prevent infection by washing hands often
- See a healthcare professional regularly
- Talk with a healthcare professional about medical or any medication issues
- Question the use of substances at work or in the home that could do possible harm to developing baby
- Eat a healthful, balanced diet
- Avoid unpasteurized (raw) milk or any derivatives
- Avoid eating raw or undercooked meat
