Parish Health Ministry: Tips for Preventing Birth Defects



January is National Birth Defects Prevention Month. Not all birth defects can be prevented. But a woman can increase her own chance of having a healthy baby. Many birth defects happen very early in pregnancy, sometimes before a woman even knows she is pregnant. Remember that about half of all pregnancies are unplanned. Here are some steps women can take to get ready for a healthy pregnancy:

- Take a vitamin with 400 micrograms of folic acid daily
- Avoid alcohol, tobacco, street drugs
- Prevent infection by washing hands often
- See a healthcare professional regularly
- Talk with a healthcare professional about medical or any medication issues
- Question the use of substances at work or in the home that could do possible harm to developing baby
- Eat a healthful, balanced diet
- Avoid unpasteurized (raw) milk or any derivatives
- Avoid eating raw or undercooked meat

While pregnant, maintain these healthful habits, get early prenatal care, and go to every appointment.

Y.E.S., Jr. (grades six through eight) meets quarterly and participates in a number of special events throughout the year. Y.E.S., Sr. (grades nine through twelve) meets weekly and takes part in outreach events that enhance the lives of others.

Linda Xerri, Youth Minister at St. Mary of the Lakes since 2003, says she has been blessed to lead the parish Youth Ministry program for the past eleven years, having witnessed the power of the Holy Spirit, as teens are moved to share their time, talents, and gifts in countless ways.

"Many volunteer their time as junior catechists in the P.R.E.P. office," Linda says. "Some read at Mass or serve as counselors at Vacation Bible School, while others lead our congregation in song. Some even serve as ushers. They cook casseroles, serve pancakes, collect canned goods with the Knights of Columbus, bake cookies, deliver food with the Society of St. Vincent de Paul and serve

meals at shelters. Each summer, dozens of high school students travel to Baltimore to shelter the homeless by participating in our annual 'Build' week with Habitat for Humanity. Our Youth Ministry is vital to the growth and sustainability of our parish because it provides young people:

- a desire to live as disciples of Jesus in an ever changing and often challenging world;
- the feeling of being part of the Body of Christ through regular and consistent participation in the life, mission, and work of our faith community; and
- a place for teens to gather and to develop a personal, spiritual and intimate relationship with Jesus Christ."
