# A Plenary Indulgence During This Year of Mercy

Pope Francis has granted that we may obtain a plenary indulgence during the Year of Mercy. An indulgence is described as a remission of the temporal punishment from sins that are already forgiven. Venial sins are forgiven at every Mass through the penitential rite or reception of Holy Communion. Mortal sins are forgiven through the Sacrament of Confession. A plenary indulgence removes all temporal punishment while a partial indulgence removes part of it.

To gain indulgences, either partial or plenary, it is necessary that the faithful:

- be in the state of grace (free from all sin);
- confess all mortal sins;
- receive Holy Eucharist;
- pray for the intentions of the Holy Father; and
- make a pilgrimage within 20 days to and pass through a Holy Door of Mercy.

#### **Cohort Process Now Underway**

For the first time in the Faith in Our Future (FIOF) initiative, neighboring parishes came together as small groups, or Cohorts, in March to begin the next step of the pastoral planning process.

The Parish Cohorts, made up of several Parish Core Teams, began their work during one of five training sessions on March 15-16 throughout Burlington, Mercer, Monmouth and Ocean Counties. There are 25 Parish Cohorts, ranging in size from three to six parishes.

The Parish Cohort process is Step 2 in an 18-month, 8-step overall initiative. In this step, Cohorts will use what they learned from the self-study/evaluation that included parishioner surveys, town hall meetings, small group discussions and verification of parish census and sacramental data. Each Cohort will work as a single unit, determining how best to strengthen the parishes included in its group. They are tasked with evaluating their parishes and developing suggestions for an organizational model or models that will allow the parishes to meet the goals set by Bishop O'Connell for the future of the Diocese.

More than 500 parishioners took part in the March training with the Cohorts having a total of six meetings from March through May. They will then submit their preliminary suggestions to the Planning Commission by June.

Representatives of the pastoral planning consultant firm, the Reid Group, conducted the training sessions, walking cohort members through organizational details and helping them to understand their roles in the overall process. Each training session also afforded an opportunity for Cohorts to get to know one another and begin to share findings from the their parish self-studies.

### Planning Commission Preparation Begins

The first gathering of the Diocesan Planning Commission also took place in March when it began preparing for the role it will play in the FIOF initiative prior to its primary work in June. This is when the Commission will review suggestions from Parish Cohorts, in light of the established goals, and return preliminary recommendations to the Cohorts with a rationale.

After the Cohorts have taken the time to study/ comment on those recommendations, the Commission will meet in October to offer final recommendations for the Bishop to consider.

The 20 or so members of the Planning Commission are priests, deacons, women religious, and lay men and women from all four counties of the Diocese who have been identified because of their experience in the parish, school and ministry setting or their professional expertise. Each was invited by Bishop O'Connell in order that the membership reflect the make-up of the diocesan community, from a wide variety of church, education, and business perspectives. Each commissioner will be assigned to a county based, for the most part, on where they live or work.

The Parish Cohort to which St. Mary of the Lakes belongs is comprised of St. Mary of the Lakes, St. Isaac Jogues, Holy Eucharist, St. Joan of Arc and St. John Neumann. This Cohort is chaired by Father Dan. Subcommittee designees from each parish also have been appointed in the areas of Stewardship, Evangelization, Sacraments, and Community Life. #### **ACA Update**

We are very grateful to everyone who gave to the 2016 Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). Our parish has currently exceeded our goal by sixteen percent, or \$164,621.00 in pledges. ACA pledge forms are at the doors of the Church for parishioners who have yet to make their gift.

Outreach to the Poor and Vulnerable: Diocesan Parish Counseling Services: Parishioners have access to short term counseling (up to 6 sessions) at locations throughout the Diocese. The program was developed by Catholic Charities and the Trenton. Diocese of Licensed counselina professionals are available to help parishioners through difficult issues such as marital problems, raising children, eldercare, bereavement or the stress of job loss that can be successfully addressed by brief counseling support. Pastors and parish priests of the Diocese can refer parishioners to the parish counseling services.





#### A Message From the Environmental Awareness Committee

Faith leaders around the world are coming together to release a powerful statement entitled, *The Interfaith Statement*, calling on world leaders to sign and ratify the Paris Climate Agreement in New York on Earth Day and to increase their ambition by committing to a 1.5°C limit of warming to protect the vulnerable. This Statement will be handed over to the President of the United Nations General Assembly at a special faith-based ceremony in New York City April 18th.



Right now, the Paris Agreement is just words on paper. We need our world leaders to sign it and start putting it into action to help make our world a better, safer place.
